Moosilauke Overnight

Time: The night before your Reunion begins, come to the Lodge! Begin with a reception at 5 pm (BYOB), and head back to campus in the late afternoon the next day after a leisurely day hike.

Meeting place: Moosilauke Ravine Lodge

Transportation: Your own transportation. Directions are available online at: www.dartmouth.edu/~doc/moosilauke/ravinelodge/directions/

Costs: \$90 for adults, \$55 for children



Description: Join others from your class for a leisurely evening, dinner, evening activity including contradancing/squaredancing and traditional films and slideshow, and a sound night's sleep at the Ravine Lodge. Get up for a great hearty breakfast and use the day to visit, watch the river, or explore the mountain at your own pace. Three meals provided (dinner, breakfast, hiker's lunch), plus reception and a comfortable bunk with sheets, pillow, and wool blankets. *Reservations are required. Print off and mail in the sign up sheet to sign up, or if you decide to come up at the last minute, call 603-764-5858 for availability.*

Skill level: No special skills needed. Let us know if you have mobility or dietary issues.

"War Canoe" River Paddle

Time: 2 to 4 pm, June 16, 17, 19 & 20

Meeting Place: Ledyard Canoe Club on the Connecticut River waterfront

Transportation: Walk down to Ledyard Canoe Club, upstream of the Ledyard Bridge.

Cost: \$10 for adults, \$5 for children

Description: A guided paddle to Titcomb Island. Visit the cabin and beach area. Led by Ledyard students or staff

Skill level: all levels are invited.

Moosilauke Day Hike

Time: 8:45 am to 5 pm, June 12 & 19

Meeting Place: Robinson Hall

Transportation: Bus ride provided to Moosilauke trailheads

Cost: \$20 per person – includes ride, hiker's lunch, bottled water and trail map.

Description: Meet at 9 am at Robinson Hall and ride to the lodge with other hikers. Arriving about 10 am, you can pick up your bag lunch, water, and trail map. Hike on your own or with the group (led by a student Lodge crew member), to the summit and back (7.6 miles round trip, 2300 feet elevation gain). Return to the Lodge by 4 pm to ride the bus back to campus.

Skill level: No specific expertise necessary. Moderate level of physical fitness will make it a more enjoyable experience. Please bring a small day pack, raincoat, and sturdy shoes.

Whitewater Rafting

Time: 2 to 5 pm, June 16, 17, 19 & 20

Meeting Place: Robinson Hall

Transportation: Bus provided to and from the river

Cost: \$30 for adults, \$20 for children

Description: Meet at Robinson Hall – everyone will be outfitted in lifejackets, helmets and spray jackets (wet suit booties are available). Raft trips will take place on the White River in Vermont or at Hartland Rapids on the Connecticut River both Class I-III. Fully guided by experienced student leaders or staff. Great for Kids!!!

Skill level: Participants should be comfortable around water. Please wear clothes you don't mind getting wet!



Harris-'66 Lodge Walk & Tour

Time: 8:30-11:30 AM, June 15, 17 & 20

Meeting Place: Robinson Hall

Transportation: Bus provided to and from the site

Cost: \$15 for adults, \$10 for children

Description: Come for a lovely walk on the south slope of Moose Mt. in nearby Etna, NH and see the DOC's newest and grandest building! The '66 Lodge on the Harris Land Tract was built entirely by students between 2005-2008 and is definitely worth a visit. Then, if you like, take a walk around the woods and maybe even up to the summit of Moose Mt.

Skill level: An easy walk through the woods is all you need to be prepared for.



High Ropes Course

Time: 2 to 5 pm, June 19 & 20

Meeting Place: Robinson Hall

Transportation: Bus provided to and from Oak Hill

Cost: \$30 for adults, \$20 for children

Description: The high ropes course is designed for small teams of participants to travel across cables and logs, working their way to the final zip line finish. This is a top of the line ropes course - one of the best in the country. Great for Teens!

Skill level: Participants must be at least 12, should be ready for a challenge and be comfortable with moderate heights and working with and supporting others.

Organic Farm and Greenhouse Tours

Time: 2 to 5 pm, June 16, 17, 19 & 20

Meeting Place: Robinson Hall

Transportation: Brief bus ride to Fullington Farm on Route 10.

Cost: \$5 for adults, \$3 for children

Brief Description: Take a walk around Dartmouth's own working organic farm. Learn about ongoing student and faculty projects, "theme" gardens, greenhouse management, and take home some tips for your own garden. Learn about the berry bushes, the maple sugar grove, and the basket ash grove, and how they are involved in Dartmouth tradition.



Skill Level: Everyone is welcome! Wear sturdy shoes and clothing to be outside.

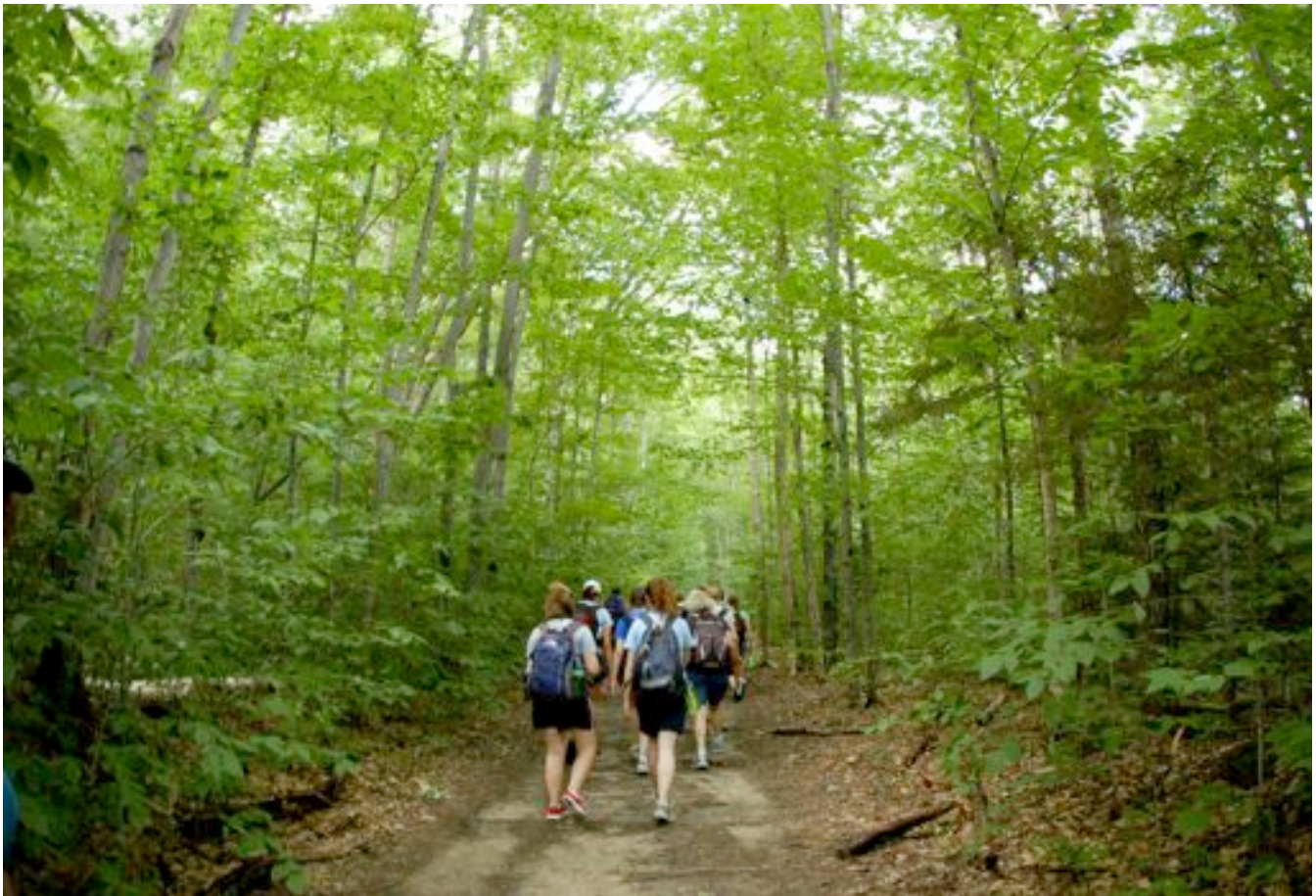
